Learn about Boat Engine Troubleshooting and Maintenance  
in Port Hadlock

Washington Sea Grant, Jefferson Education Center, WSU  
Jefferson County Extension and the Northwest School of  
Wooden Boatbuilding will conduct a four-evening Boat  
Engine Troubleshooting and Maintenance Workshop in  
December for commercial fishermen and recreational  
boaters.

Participants will learn to troubleshoot problems in the  
fuel, lubrication, electrical, cooling, exhaust and  
drive systems of diesel and gas inboards, stern drives  
and outboards (two-cycle and four-stroke). The workshop  
will also teach proper maintenance techniques to  
prevent the most common problems.

evening.
